

## Concurrent Credit Students and Faculty:

Following (below - items I-V) are the schools I am aware of in my research that either ACCEPT or DO NOT ACCEPT concurrent credit type courses. If you do not find the school you are interested in, I would suggest that you go directly to the school website(s) you are interested in (usually information can be found in transfer links or search by "concurrent enrollment" on the school website), or you can call the Registrar's office at the school(s) you are interested in and ask if they accept college courses taught through concurrent enrollment programs. If you call, be sure to indicate that these are college-rigorous courses taught by qualified instructors and partnered with our NNU faculty.

I am sorry that I do not have the time to check for each school for you right now, as this process simply takes time that I have to parcel out. However, I would be interested in knowing what you discover.

I. My Research. Following are Colleges/Universities that generally ACCEPT CCP Credit on a case-by-case basis, in most situations transfer acceptance is specific to the department/major of interest. Nothing that I have found in their policy documents suggests they do not accept CCP or concurrent enrollment courses rather they are evaluated against their own academic courses case-by-case. However, an official NNU transcript must be sent to the Registrar's Office at the corresponding university/college for evaluation of NNU credits being transferred and their acceptance. In addition, be sure that you have your class syllabus available for review. You will want to review the following transfer policies at each school via the website below for admissions and transfer of credits.

--Most Western U.S. schools, including Idaho universities, grant CCP credit for courses.

III. My Research. Following are Colleges/Universities that generally DO NOT ACCEPT CCP Credit. Their policy documents specifically say they do not accept CCP or concurrent/dual enrollment courses from courses taught in the high school; although some will use CCP for "advanced" work in a specific department. Thus, taking CCP courses demonstrates "advanced work" by the student and may help them in the admission process even though the credit will not be counted.

--Babson College (Babson Park, MA ). This is a private exclusive college with a "business" focus.

--Columbia University (IvyLeague - NY). Very high registration requirements and low acceptance rates based on a pool of applicants.

--Duke University (NC). "We will consider these courses (dual enrollment) for credit only if they are not included in your high school record" [<http://www.admissions.duke.edu/faq/index.asp> .

--Furman (SC). Website notes they are the "oldest, largest and most selective private (Baptist origin) institution in South Carolina".

--Princeton University (IvyLeague - NJ) "Although students are not eligible for credit for college courses taken through a dual-enrollment program, students may earn advanced placement for high scores on departmental placement tests offered by some Princeton departments"

--Univ. of Puget Sound (Tacoma, WA). This is a private exclusive college. "College credits earned prior to high school graduation may transfer to Puget Sound if the credits are earned in regularly scheduled college classes taught on a college campus. Such courses must be more advanced in the discipline than courses normally offered at the high school level. ... The university does not award transfer credit for college-in-the-high-school courses." --Whitman College (Walla Walla, WA). This is a private exclusive college.

--Yale University (IvyLeague - CT). Very high registration requirements and low acceptance rates based on a pool of applicants.

IV. Others Research. The University of Connecticut has provided an extensive list of institutions that they have found that either accept, or not, concurrent enrollment credits. They do emphasize the following, that we/NUU also suggest in our 'Student Guide': "each student should verify this information for the particular schools to which they are applying ... as there is often no clear policy." V. Following are States that have legislated, or strongly advocate, the acceptance of university credits from CCP programs, like Northwest Nazarene University, that are specifically accredited by NACEP (National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships). Northwest Nazarene University currently is the only NACEP accredited program in the State of Idaho, and in the Northwest Region.

--Utah has not legislated acceptance, although most will accept CCP-like credits as they have NACEP accredited schools.

--Brigham Young University, private university, does accept CCP-like credits.

--Other states are in process of looking at similar legislation.

As a final thought about the listing above. I would suggest that the student/parent search the college/university website as I did. Most policies are relatively clear in terms of acceptance or not for CCP, or concurrent credit, type courses that are taught in the high school setting like the NNU CCP courses. However, some of the credit transfer language is vague enough that acceptance would be likely on a case-by-case basis usually specific to the department/major. The point is that, generally most colleges/universities will accept transfer credit on an official transcript like an NNU transcript. Unless the college/university says they do not accept such credit in their policies, a very good case can be made for acceptance.

Hopefully this will help.
