Given by Carl (Tiny) and Mary Bellamy in memory of Tiny's mother, Glena Norene Bellamy, the *Glena Norene Bellamy Track Scholarship* is awarded to a member of the Track and Field or Cross-Country Team with preference given to an ethnic minority student.

Glena Norene Giles was born in 1894 in Beacher City, Illinois. As a young child she moved with her parents to Clinton, Oklahoma where her father was the community's first fire chief. After attending Weatherford College in Oklahoma, she taught school for one year. It was during that year she met Carl Worthington Bellamy, and they were married July 4, 1914. The Bellamy family, including four children, moved to California where Tiny was born. The family later moved to a farm near Donald, Oregon before finally settling in Goldendale, Washington.

Glena was an unwavering inspiration and Christian example to her eight children and her sons and daughters-in-law. Three of her sons and two of her daughters attended Northwest Nazarene College. Glena was a charter member of three Nazarene churches and founded the church in Goldendale, Washington. She passed away on Thanksgiving Day shortly before her 93rd birthday.

Criteria for the Award

1. Recipients are to be students who meet general scholastic requirements and show potential for academic success and degree completion.
2. Recipients are to be members of the Track & Field or Cross-Country NNU athletic teams with preference given to an ethnic minority student.
3. Financial need shall be a consideration in the awarding of this scholarship.
4. Recipients may receive the award in successive years, not to exceed four years.
5. Nominations for this award shall be made by the track coach and athletic director through the Department of Kinesiology and the Office of Financial Aid.
